Pulmonary Rehabilitation: The Lung Function Power Hour

COPD, emphysema and other chronic lung diseases cause sufferers to have difficulty breathing. With a significantly decreased quality of life, symptoms often lead to anxiety and depression as well.

Although pulmonary rehabilitation is not a cure for lung diseases, it can give sufferers a new lease on life by decreasing symptoms, improving breathing and thus the ability to function better in one's daily life.

Nevada Regional Medical Center now offers pulmonary rehabilitation to improve lung function for sufferers of chronic lung diseases.

Pulmonary rehabilitation combines education about specific diseases with monitored exercise at the hospital.

Three times each week, patients spend one hour at pulmonary rehab, learning and training with a variety of aerobic exercises. Education helps patients understand their disease as well as treatments that may be used to manage it.

Each patient's physical ability is assessed with a walk before developing an individual exercise plan. Exercises are designed to build strength and endurance over the course of the program, maximizing the patient's ability to complete the tasks of daily living.

In addition to gaining back control over their lives, Pulmonary Rehab director, Andrea Miller finds her patients gain relationships with others who have similar struggles.

“They look forward to that social interaction and they gain so much confidence in themselves.” Miller said.

Pulmonary rehabilitation requires physician referral, preferably from a pulmonologist. For more information, call (417) 667-3355.

“In-Between” Visits

Better care for people living with chronic illnesses.

Life with multiple chronic illnesses means sometimes a regular doctor’s office visit is just not soon enough. With Chronic Care Management, Kim Fleming, RN, is able to help patients in between regular appointments. She also helps patients learn how to effectively manage conditions and stay healthier.

After hours, program participants have access to a 24-hour nurse phone line which also notifies the Chronic Care Management nurse, who will then follow up with the patient.

Chronic Care Management works hand-in-hand with the patient’s primary care provider and Medicare Annual Wellness Exams.

Examples of chronic conditions include, but are not limited to:

- Alzheimer’s disease and related dementia
- Arthritis (osteoarthritis and rheumatoid)
- Asthma
- Atrial fibrillation
- Autism spectrum disorders
- Cancer
- Cardiovascular Disease
- COPD
- Depression
- Diabetes
- Hypertension
- Infectious diseases such as HIV/AIDS
